In addition it also supports GUS bins for events at Kuta Beach like Rip Curl Surf Music Festival which took place 8 to 9 October 2011 and the Kuta Karnival that lasted 14 to 16 October 2011.

They clean up the beach everyday and bring up the rubbish collected from the beach and warungs to be disposed to the landfill. The Tim Kecil consisting of representatives of the Coalition, representatives of Hardy's retailers, academics from the University of Warmadewa and the Environment Agency (BLH) of Bali Province. So far the Koalisi Bali Bebas Sampah Plastik in which GUS joined set the standard guidelines for retailers to reduce plastic bags usage by providing environmentally friendly alternatives instead of plastic bags, which are not finalized yet.
