Environmental Education at SD 3 Bondalem, Buleleng

This activity was initiated by the residents of Bondalem, Buleleng to solve the waste problem. So they incorporate environmental education for school kids as part of a long-term solution.



Monitoring Waste Facilities (TPS—Tempat Pengelolaan Sampah)
